WALKING AND RUNNING CLUB:

Our walking and running club has started. We meet in the gym on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays at 12:15 pm. Students who want to walk, walk on the red line. Students, who want to run, run on the black line. For each lap they collect a Popsicle stick. After five laps, they trade in four sticks for a coloured one. Fach coloured stick equals five laps. Three sticks equal a kilometre. Students are free to move back and forth from the red and black lines if and when they need a break. They are also free to sit in the centre and

stretch their leg muscles if they need to. We record the number of laps the students do and add these points to their school leadership team at the end of each month. As an extra incentive, Ms. Campbell will treat the top four students (the ones with the most laps) to lunch just in time for Christmas Break.


SCHOLASTIC BOOK FAIR COMING....
