Kindergarten - Mrs. Kern

Today marks our 80th day in school. We are looking forward to February 26th, when we will be celebrating our 100th day.

Last week, we went skating for the first time at our outdoor rink across from the street. It was quite a successful time and we were thankful to have Mr. Kern and another paramedic, Marek, on hand to help lace up the skates. The Kindergartens are keen to go again and we are hoping to get on the ice again this Thursday with the Grade 1 class. Any helpers would be greatly appreciated. Please let me know if you're available to assist.

This week, we welcomed a new student, Mariesha Shanoss, to our classroom. We now have 12 students (4 girls and 8 boys).

As the temperature starts to fall, it is important that students are dressed warmly. Snow pants and mittens are a must especially on skating days. Thank you for your assistance in this area.

GRADE 3 - Mrs. Barr

The boys and girls are learning many ways to show multiplication. Ask your child to show you any of the following methods:

Skip counting
Arrays
Equal groups or sets
Stick trick or intersection model
Repeated addition
Equation with factors and a product

Block trains

In Science, we are learning about food chains and webs. Ask your child about terms like producer, consumer, decomposer, omnivore, carnivore and herbivore. We've been reading and watching videos to learn more about energy pyramids and the interconnectedness of all living and nonliving things on the planet.

Scholastic book orders for February will be sent home soon and are due back to Mr. or Mrs. Barr by 3 p.m. on Thursday, February 14th.

GRADE 4 - Mrs. Lattie

The students in Grade 4 have returned to school eager to work and excited about learning. We began the week talking about responsibilities, team work and goal setting.

In math we are starting our division unit. Students will be learning how to divide using 2 numbers. Most students are caught up with their work, if not I will be sending them home to complete.

In Science our class is learning about the salmon Watersheds, Salmon Life cycle, Salmon Habitat and Salmon and Climate Change. The grade fours are responsible for looking after the fish tank. Every morning two students go and check the temperature making sure it stays at 7-8 degrees.

In Language Arts we are still working on reading comprehension strategies, and reviewing conventions. We do 5 minute writing challenge once a week. These weekly Writes will encourage development of composition skills, creative thinking, and supporting opinions in writing.

In art we are getting ready for Chinese New Year. We are making lanterns and a Large Dragon to be displayed in our room.

Some students need to top up their supplies, more duotangs are needed, and some need pencils. Please check with your child.

Grade 5 - Mr. Schwab

Dear Parents/ Guardians,

We are now 1 month into 2019! Our class has begun a new unit in math: multiplication and division. Every students should be reviewing their basic facts from 0 to 144. If they can answer the multiplication questions, switch and review division, soon students will be working on multi digit questions and a solid knowledge of basic facts would really be beneficial. After Spring Break students will need a calculator as we will be doing equations and activities that will require using those devices.

In Language Arts, we are working on the art of persuasive writing. Students have learned and are practicing the following format: what is your opinion? why? Why? And what was that again? So far, they have wrote 4 persuasive assignments. Please encourage them at home when listening to the news or discussing community events, to state what they believe, and give 3 reasons, and then give a summary of what they are defending. Next Unit will be Narrative Writing!

In Social Studies, we have begun a mini unit on origins of people in Canada. This will soon lead into a unit on immigration. Please share with your child your cultural background. Help them be able to demonstrate or explain where they come from? And share some traditions or cultural experiences with them. We will examine values and how friends and family influence those values. Next Unit will be Government.

In Science we are studying muscles, bones, skin, and nervous system. Next Unit will be resources how they are used, managed, and marketed.

In technology we are using coding, designing, and our imaginations to create origin stories. Students are taking life experiences, family backgrounds, and scientific thought and will be working on projects that share visually their understanding of how life came to be .

Please also check with your child if they need to replace or top up their school supplies. it is time to refill their pencils, erasers, check that they have a ruler, pencil crayons, glue, and scissors. Looking forward to the month of February. Students should be completing weekly spelling activities. Most students either have a science, socials, or a math assignment that they are finishing. You can always check with me to make sure they have completed assignments.

- If your child has a change to their routine (not taking bus, or taking the bus), please send a note with your child that morning or call the school before 2:30 p.m.

Your presence at the school and your understanding with regards to our routines is appreciated. Thank you.

Head Lice

Parents & Guardians have the responsibility to take an active role in the prevention of head lice outbreaks by:
a) frequently checking your child's head for lice or nits. 2) talking to your child about not sharing hats, brushes, helmets, hair accessories and other personal items. 3) tying back long hair. It is important that we work together to control head lice. If you child has lice, please ensure the proper steps are taken to get rid of them. Should you require support for medications, the public health unit may be able to provide treatments and information on prevention.

If you are interested in volunteering at the school please let Ms. Campbell know. A group of parents would like to support the school and come in to do head checks on a regular basis.

If we notice that your child has lice, we will calling home so that families can immediately tend to their child.


