
PINK SHIRT DAY

Kindergarten - Mrs. Kern

Monday (the 25th), we celebrated our 100th day. We had many fun things to do to mark the occasion. Thank you to Giselle (Gemma's mom), for being on hand to help when we did a Valentine craft and also for a 100th day science activity.

The Kindergartens are continuing to write every day. Last week they were learning about labels and they got to label Mrs. Kern and Mrs. Bolger.

In Math, we have just begun a new unit on exploring geometry and measurement. The students will be learning about the shape and space of 3-D objects and how to compare 2 objects to tell which is taller, longer, heavier or holds more.

GRADE 3 - Mrs. Barr

Students have been combining Social Studies and Writing skills to cover the topics of biographies and European explorers. Using a graphic organizer, students took notes as they watched videos about the lives of John Cabot and Henry Hudson. Ask your child to tell you what important facts they remember about these two men.

Students have also been combining Art and Science to learn more about animal food Chains. Ask your Child to explain the flow of energy in the Chain that they Created (sun, plant, Consumer/herbivore, Consumer/Carnivore or omnivore, decomposer).

Handwriting lessons have continued. First, they worked with the Clock Climbers (a,C,d,g,q). Then, they learned to write the Kite Strings (i, u, w, t, j, o, p, r, s). The third family of letters is called the Loop Group (b, e, f, h, k). Please encourage your child to practice these letters at home.

GRADE 6 - Ms. Plewak

The students are wrapping up and finishing units in social studies, math and language arts this week as report cards are being prepared and will be sent home the second week of March.

The students taking French have been practising a French play entitled "Boucles D' Or et les Trois Ours" or Goldilocks and the Three Bears. They made hand puppets from socks and presented the play to the kindergartens. The kindergartens thought it was pretty neat and understood the play despite the French. The students had a blast with this play. They will now start creating a book about themselves in French using Book Creator on the IPad.

This week the students will be bringing in their pets for their oral presentations. Each student wrote an essay about a pet they used to have or a pet they have now. They are also able to bring in their pets this week as part of their presentation. Some students will bring in pictures to share if their pet is no longer here or if they are unable to bring them in. As parents, you can appreciate how hectic it gets when organizing your own child to go places. Here we have 157 children to organize, and sometimes the end of the day can be a little busy. We would like to remind all parents about our end of the day routines.

- If picking up your child, please wait outside the boot room doors. All children will be exiting the school from the boot room. Please use the back parking lot for pick up.
- If your child has a change to their routine (not taking bus, or taking the bus), please send a note with your child that morning or call the school before 2:30 p.m.

Your presence at the school and your understanding with regards to our routines is appreciated. Thank you.

Head Lice

Parents & Guardians have the responsibility to take an active role in the prevention of head lice outbreaks by: a) frequently checking your child's head for lice or nits. 2) talking to your child about not sharing hats, brushes, helmets, hair accessories and other personal items. 3) tying back long hair. It is important that we work together to control head lice. If you child has lice, please ensure the proper steps are taken to get rid of them. Should you require support for medications, the public health unit may be able to provide treatments and information on prevention.

If you are interested in volunteering at the school please let Ms. Campbell know. A group of parents would like to support the school and come in to do head checks on a regular basis.

If we notice that your child has lice, we will be calling home so that families can immediately tend to their child.
