#### Kindergarten - Mrs. Kern

Hello Families,

I hope that everyone had an enjoyable long weekend. It was nice to see the students after being away for four days.

We have a new addition to our room. Mr. Dodd is an Educational Assistant who is now helping out in the Kindergarten and Grade 1 classes.

We write every day. At present, we have been drawing and writing about local wildflowers. In Science, our focus has been on predicting and recording the daily weather. The gymnastics equipment is all put away and we are now enjoying outdoor games and walks when it's sunny. In Math, we are learning about numbers to 10. Students will be reviewing counting forwards and backwards to 10 and representing a number as two parts. For example, 8 books on a shelf can be arranged on 2 shelves in sets of 1 and 7, 2 and 6, 3 and 5, or 4 and 4.

#### Office Hours

Mrs. Harris will be in the office from 8:40 am to 2:30 pm. Her break and lunch is from 11:00 am to 12:00pm. If you are calling to leave a message for your child, like alternative plans for getting home, please call no later than 2:15 pm, otherwise we can't guarantee your child getting the message.



As parents, you can appreciate how hectic it gets when organizing your own child to go places. Here we have 157 children to organize, and sometimes the end of the day can be a little busy. We would like to remind all parents about our end of the day routines.

- If picking up your child, please wait outside the boot room doors. All children will be exiting the school from the boot room. Please use the back parking lot for pick up.
- If your child has a change to their routine (not taking bus, or taking the bus), please send a note with your child that morning or call the school before 2:30 p.m.

Your presence at the school and your understanding with regards to our routines is appreciated. Thank you.

#### Head Lice

Parents & Guardians have the responsibility to take an active role in the prevention of head lice outbreaks by: a) frequently checking your child's head for lice or nits. 2) talking to your child about not sharing hats, brushes, helmets, hair accessories and other personal items. 3) tying back long hair. It is important that we work together to control head lice. If you child has lice, please ensure the proper steps are taken to get rid of them. Should you require support for medications, the public health unit may be able to provide treatments and information on prevention.

If you are interested in volunteering at the school please let Ms. Campbell know. A group of parents would like to support the school and come in to do head checks on a regular basis.

If we notice that your child has lice, we will be calling home so that families can immediately tend to their child.
